





In honor of all veterans and Native American Heritage Month, Jemez Springs Public Library presents a talk by Judith Avila co-author of *Code Talker*, the memoir of the last code talker Chester Nez. Chester's grandson, Latham Nez, will also speak in his grandfather's honor. Chester Nez passed away in June this year.

**Chester Nez** was the last survivor of the original 29 Navajo code talkers of WWII – the heroic Navajo Marines who developed the only unbroken code in modern warfare.
